### **CSIP 3.D.5 Develop, implement and review annually the School Police Department portion of the Operations Plan**

Strategy 3.D.5.a: Continue to build and strengthen public relations through community orientated policing

- a. Make it a priority to speak with community members to create and maintain a positive relationship by attending at least two events per building per year
- b. Develop committee of stakeholders to gain input from staff, parents and community

Strategy 3.D.5.b: Maintain safe and secure facilities

- c. Attend building drills to consult with administrators on safety procedures
- d. Establish benchmark response times for priority and non-priority calls
  1. Priority response benchmark three minutes for emergency calls
  2. Non-priority response benchmark 15 minutes for non-emergency calls
- e. Coordinating with local/area law enforcement agencies to support our schools in emergency management planning

Strategy 3.D.5.c: Ensure Officers maintain required state mandated training

- f. Complete post hour as required by the state of Missouri by completing 24 hours annually
- g. Assign training officer to ensure all School police personnel stay in compliance with requirements

Strategy 3.D.5.d: Review policies, procedures and laws regarding SROs and School administrators and their functions in the school

- h. Form a sub-committee of SROs and School Administrators to review policies, procedures, and laws. This committee will meet monthly to conduct after action-review following any incident involving school policy violations and crimes to review actions by both groups
- i. This committee may recommend changes to current practice to the Executive Director of Operations

- 1. Currently, SROs have one vehicle each. These vehicles are aging and need a plan for replacement. The District will plan to replace one vehicle per year over the next 2-4 years. This year the department added a 2014 all-wheel drive Dodge Charger (police package)**
- 2. As the District grows there will be a need to add a swing swift police officer to cover the evening events. With Middle School having 7<sup>th</sup> grade in their building this will add a third location for night supervision**
- 3. Currently, the District has one AR-15 on hand. The department plans to add more AR-15 rifles as the District increases in growth**
- 4. Form a sub-committee comprised of administrators and SROs to review policy, procedure and law violations. This committee may offer recommendations based on review of incidents to the Executive Director of Operations**
